Points will be awarded as follows:

US Equestrian Federation USEF

DIVISIONS AND POINT REQUIREMENTS

IN HAND: ACPS Region shows will be considered Recognized competitions for the In Hand Division for classes with a minimum of five entries.

In addition to points awarded for placing, points may be earned as follows:

Champion at Recognized Show: 12

Champion at Unrecognized Show: 6

Reserve at Recognized Show: 10

Reserved at Unrecognized Show: 5

Certificate: 20 points

Bronze: 40 points

Silver: 75 points

Gold: 150 points

DRIVING:

In addition to, or in the absence of, points earned for placing at ADS and/or USA Equestrian recognized shows:

- 5 points will be awarded for completing at Training level in combined driving
- 10 points will be awarded for completing at Preliminary level in combined driving.
- 15 points will be awarded for completing at Intermediate level in combined driving.
- 20 points will be awarded for completing at Advanced level in combined driving.

Certificate: 20 points
Bronze: 40 points
Silver: 75 points
Gold: 150 points

EVENTING

In addition to, or in the absence of, points earned for placing at USEA and/or USA Equestrian recognized competitions:

- 5 points will be awarded for completing at Novice or below levels.
- 10 points will be awarded for completing at Training level
- 15 points will be awarded for completing at Preliminary level.
- 20 points will be awarded for completing at Intermediate level.
- 25 points will be awarded for completing at Advanced level.

Bronze: 40 points
Silver: 75 points

COMPETITIVE TRAIL/ ENDURANCE:

In addition to, or in the absence of, points earned for placing at AERC or NATRC recognized competitions:

- 10 points will be earned for winning the best-conditioned award.
- 5 points will be earned for completing a 20-49 mile ride.
- 10 points will be earned for completing a 50-99 mile ride.
- 15 points will be earned for completing a 100 or more mile ride.

Bronze: 40 points
Silver: 75 points
Gold: 150 points

DRESSAGE:

In addition to, or in the absence of, points earned for placing at USDF and/or USA Equestrian recognized shows:

- 5 points will be earned for scores 60% or over
- 10 points will be earned for scores 65% or over
- 15 points will be earned for scores 70% or over and, in addition
- 10 points will be earned for scores 55% or over at third level and above.

HUNTER:

In addition to points awarded for placing, points may be earned as follows:

In addition to points awarded for placing, points may be earned as follows:

NON-COMPETITIVE DISCIPLINES

In these disciplines points are earned for participation.

FOXHUNTER: Master of Foxhounds or Hunt Secretary must sign

Certificate: Fairly hunted at least eight times with foxhounds or beagles for one season.

Bronze: Fairly hunted at least eight times with foxhounds or beagles for two seasons.

Silver: Fairly hunted at least eight times with foxhounds or beagles for three seasons.

Gold: Fairly hunted at least eight times with foxhounds or beagles for four seasons.

PONY CLUB: District Commissioner must sign.

Certificate: Regular Pony Club mount used at least eight times for one season.

Bronze: Regular Pony Club mount used at least eight times for two seasons.

Silver: Regular Pony Club mount used at least eight times for three seasons.

Gold: Regular Pony Club mount used at least eight times for four seasons.

4H: 4H leader must sign.

Certificate: Regular 4H mount at least eight times for one season.

Bronze: Regular 4H mount at least eight times for two seasons.

Silver: Regular 4H mount at least eight times for three seasons.

Gold: Regular 4H mount at least eight times for four seasons.

WORKING RANCH HORSE: Ranch foreman must sign.

Certificate: Used for regular ranch work at least eight times for one season.

Bronze: Used for regular ranch work at least eight times for two seasons.

Silver: Used for regular ranch work at least eight times for three seasons.

Gold: Used for regular ranch work at least eight times for four seasons.

THERAPEUTIC RIDING/ DRIVING: Program director must sign.

Certificate: Used in a therapeutic program at least eight times for one season.

Bronze: Used in a therapeutic program at least eight times for two seasons.

Silver: Used in a therapeutic program at least eight times for three seasons.

Gold: Used in a therapeutic program at least eight times for four seasons.
