Region VIII Stallion Carns 20023 Toorgen Laddie Award

ACPS awards the Tooreen Laddie trophy, donated by Mr. & Mrs. Edward Harris, to outstanding stallions that have had a positive influence on our breed through their offspring.

Our 2023 winner is a stallion that has consistently passed on his cooperative, inquisitive temperament, athleticism and excellent movement. As a result, his get perform well in many disciplines including



dressage, eventing, ranch work, jumpers and combined driving. He also has passed along soundness, good health and strong limbs with a bit of extra spring that make for stylish, powerful jumping ability.

In short, he was an excellent representative of Connemara type: athletic with correct conformation, intelligent and canny at problem solving, and possessed of a very user-friendly attitude.

He sired 17 purebred foals in his first generation and 8 in each of his second and third generations. He had 24 halfbreds in the first generation and one each in the second and third. Among his most notable offspring are two outstanding broodmares, that produced a total of 12 purebreds and one halfbred.

Four of his daughters competed in combined driving as singles, pairs, tandem and four-in-hand, winning at all the major FEI driving competitions in the US, some multiple times, developing quite a huge following. Two of them later competed in eventing and three in dressage. Others have excelled at dressage, as well, developing quite a huge following. One was 4th Level Champion of the Oregon Dressage Society, carried his owner to her USDF Silver Medal with scores over 60 percent including 2 each at Fourth Level and Prix St. George. Nine others also compete in dressage.

Purebreds and halfbreds also excelled at eventing. One competed through Open Preliminary at prestigious events and later went on to teach his owner's students the fine points of the sport. Another attracted

the eye of the eventing legend Karen O'Connor who bought him for a student in Virginia

where he now competes in eventing and hunter/jumper competitions.

The second generation brought two more excellent broodmares and others that have gone on to careers in the hunter/jumper world. The nine offspring in the third. What is special about this stallion? His owners, who took a gamble and bought him as a weanling, say he far exceeded their expectations and hopes. "As a sire, he produced offspring that exemplify the best qualities of the Connemara. The joy and experiences his foals have brought to children, amateurs and serious competitors through the international level have been priceless to us. He has produced more than foals. He has enriched our life and made the lives of the owners of his offspring happier. That is special indeed!

This special stallion, sired by Tre Awain Ginger Blue out of Ros Na Ri Moira, was bred by Kathryn Roe of Deming, Washington and spent his career at Chris and Phillip Knox's farm in Pocatello, Idaho. 

We are the happy new owners of Ruby King Sparrow "Cian," an 11-year-old, grey Connemara gelding, who we purchased from Susan McLaughlin, ACPS Region 8 Governor. Our journey with these special and unique ponies began in the late 1960's, thousands of miles away in Pennsylvania. I was fortunate to be raised by a mom, Elisabeth T. Ervin, who was a long-time ACPS member



and centered riding teacher. We had many Connemaras over the years and rode them in shows, on trails, and in the field, fox hunting. They never faltered at any task we asked

of them and were our most reliable mounts.

Much later, and many dressage horses, mostly warmbloods, I arrived at a point where I wanted and needed a steadfast equine partner, also one closer to the ground. This past year and half saw mom's passing, graduate school completion, and a spinal fusion for me. My body is stronger for the fusion, with a great deal of metal added, and I am healing well. Deciding to look for a Connemara pony was

easy, and one mom would have been so pleased. As I get to know Cian, we plan small shows and outings. My husband, Rich, and I are volunteer forest rangers for the USFS in a program in Colorado called Poudre Wilderness Volunteers. The position involves providing mounted patrols (though other rangers hike or ski) to watch over USFS trails and assist visitors to the forest. Mostly, it is meet and greet and providing directions and maps. We can see Cian taking on this role and are looking forward to a long partnership with him.






