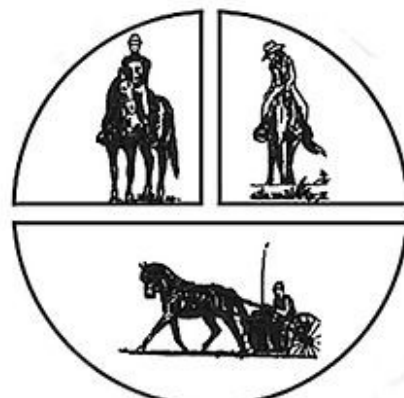

General Information, Rules, and Regulations

All competitors entering either the Hartland Riding Club Show (Saturday), the ACPS Region I Breed Show (Sunday), or both, must comply with the general rules and regulations provided in this prizelist. Please consult each show's separate page for rules and regulations relevant to only that specific competition.

- 1) Both shows run on volunteer power—we need volunteers and appreciate the work they do. Please sign up in advance or come to the volunteer table during the show to offer your help—and *thank our volunteers for their efforts!*
- 2) The Show Committees would like to remind all competitors, parents, coaches, trainers, and spectators to practice good sportsmanship throughout the weekend. Let us know how things are going in an informative way; we will do our best to keep things running smoothly.
- 3) ASTM/SEI approved helmets, with a properly adjusted chinstrap, are required while mounted, whether English or Western. No penalty will be assessed if a helmet is worn while presenting in hand.
- 4) Adults may show ponies in all classes unless class specifications state otherwise. Juniors are those who have not turned 19 by January 1, 2026.
- 5) When applicable, all classes will be held in accordance with U.S. Equestrian Federation (USEF) rules and specifications.
- 6) Vet will be on call, EMT on grounds during competition days.
- 7) **GMHA requires a Certificate of Rabies Vaccination and proof of negative Coggins within 12 months, and proof of vaccination against EHV/equine influenza within 6 months, for all horses entering the grounds.**
- 8) Camping is not allowed on the GMHA grounds for this event.

Stabling

Stabling will be in D Barn, with overflow to C Barn. Stabling is \$37/night if a GMHA member or \$50 if a non-GMHA member. Hay and Shavings may be purchased for \$13 per bale/bag, or you can bring your own. Please indicate any special requests on your entry, and we will do our best to accommodate. Stall assignments will be posted at the GMHA office in the morning on Friday, July 17, along with contact info for the emergency vet. Stall assignments will also be posted on the ACPS Region I Facebook page the week before the show. **Stalls must be stripped clean when you leave or we get a BIG fine, which we will pass on to you. Thank you!**

Class and Other Fees

Opening date: June 1, 2026

Closing Date: July 11, 2026 (must be postmarked by this date)

Scratches after closing date (7/11) will receive refund of stabling/shavings only.

Late Fee: All entries postmarked after July 11, 2026, or submitted on the day of either show, are subject to a \$15.00 late fee per horse/rider combination

Postage Due Fee: Entries arriving "postage due" will be assessed a \$20 processing fee, plus the cost of the supplemental postage

Show Administration Fee: *(Waived for current HRC members)* \$20 show administration fee per horse/rider combination

Performance Classes: \$20/class

Costume Class: \$20/entry, whether ridden, led, or some combination thereof!

In Hand Classes: \$15/class

Mounted Lead Line: \$10 per entry

Scratches and/or no shows to a class will not be refunded. Late add classes are permitted at no additional charge and must be paid in the show office at that time with a check or cash (may also leave signed blank check with secretary). Bounced checks will incur a \$35 insufficient funds fee.

HRC Rules and Regulations

The following rules and regulations apply to the Hartland Riding Club Horse Show only:

- 1) Stallions must be handled by a qualified adult.
- 2) All classes will award ribbons from 1st through 6th place.
- 3) Formal attire and braiding are welcome but not required. Horse and rider tack and attire should be clean, tidy, and properly adjusted for safety.
- 4) Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine or split classes as entries warrant, and change the show schedule if it becomes necessary.
- 5) Horses may only be ridden by those who have signed a GMHA and ACPS/HRC waiver.
- 6) Trot/jog riders may not enter any canter/lope classes.
- 7) A horse or pony may show only once in each class, with the exception of classes 17 and 19; in these classes only, two different riders may share the same horse or pony, in separate turns.
- 8) Judge's decisions are final.
- 9) If your horse is a known kicker, place a red ribbon in its tail.
- 10) Unruly horses and/or any person mistreating any horse will be dismissed from the class and/or showgrounds.

Hartland Riding Club Horse Show Class Specifications

Fitting and Showmanship: Open to all horses and ponies. To be judged on the competitor's ability to properly groom and prepare the horse to be judged, and their showmanship performance during the class. To be shown on the lead, halter and lead rope or bridle acceptable; no other tack or equipment is allowed. Exhibitors will show the horse in the arena as per the judge's instructions.

Lead Line: Open to riders aged 9 and under. To be shown at the walk, with a short trot or jog. Not to cross-enter in any class other than Lead Line designated classes. May be shown in English or Western attire. Simon Says class will include fun instructions from the judge.

Equitation: To be shown at the walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope as designated by the class, both directions. The judge may provide additional requests. To be judged on hands, seat, and control of the horse. May be asked to back.

Pleasure: To be shown at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope, as designated by the class, both directions. The judge may provide additional requests. May be asked to back. To be judged on performance, manners, soundness and the horse's suitability to serve as a pleasure mount.

Trail: Open to all riders, to be shown individually through a course of 6-8 trail obstacles (may include mailbox, bridge, backing over rails, small jump, water crossing). May be shown in English or Western attire. Horses entered in In Hand Trail (class 32) cannot cross enter into a mounted trail class.

Costume Class: Open to ALL ages, horses, and ponies. Mounted (walk only; on lead line acceptable), or unmounted. Get creative and show us your best costume for you and your mount! May be shown in English or Western attire.

Sit-A-Buck: Riders will supply their own dollar bill, and the winner will take home the pot of dollars lost during the class! The rider will place a dollar bill in between their seat or thigh and the horse's bare back. Dollar bill must be visible to the judge. The riders will go through a series of ridden commands at the walk, trot, and possible canter. Winner will be the rider who is able to keep the dollar from falling. May be shown in English or Western attire.

Jumper Classes: Run under Table 2b: untimed first round, timed shortened jump off round immediately following a clear round.

Championships awarded in Overall Walk Trot Youth and Adult, and Overall W/T/C Youth and Adult (points from fitting and showmanship, pleasure, equitation and trail to be included) Youth = 18 or under as of January 1, 2026.

ACPS Region I Rules and Regulations

The following rules and regulations apply to the ACPS Region I Connemara Breed Show only:

- 1) All exhibited Connemaras, Halfbred Connemaras, or Connemara Sporthorses must be permanently registered with the American Connemara Pony Society and/or the Connemara Pony Breeders' Society of Galway, Ireland, or any other Connemara Society recognized by the parent organization, CPBS. All Connemaras under the age of two years must have (or have applied for) a Temporary Foal Certificate (TFC). **A Copy of Registration or TFC must accompany all entries.**
- 2) All ponies must be exhibited under their full registered names.
- 3) All entries may be shown as Native ponies or as appropriate to their performance division. Braiding is optional. Stallions may compete in performance classes.
- 4) We do not have past entries or your old paperwork, so please send us a fresh copy of everything.
- 5) The Fitting & Showing Class is not eligible for points toward year end ACPS awards.
- 6) Trophy and six ribbons awarded in each class.

42. Novice Handler age 8-11 Open to all breeds. This, or class 43, required class for Junior Championship. Judged on the ability of the handler to exhibit their pony to their best advantage, with additional scoring being placed on the grooming and presentation of both horse and handler. Handlers may be attired in full show attire or may present in polo shirts and slacks, but must be clean, neat and workmanlike. *The Cynthia Richards Novice Handler Trophy*
43. Junior Handler age 12-18 Open to all breeds. This, or class 42, required class for Junior Championship. Judged on the ability of the handler to exhibit their pony to their best advantage, with additional scoring being placed on the grooming and presentation of both horse and handler. Handlers may be attired in full show attire or may present in polo shirts and slacks, but must be clean, neat and workmanlike. *The Brenda Martin Junior Handler Trophy*
44. Fitting and Showmanship Open to all breeds and all ages of handler. Judged on the ability of the handler to exhibit their pony to their best advantage, with additional scoring being placed on the grooming and presentation of both horse and handler. Handlers may be attired in full show attire or may present in polo shirts and slacks, but must be neat, clean and workmanlike.

Stallion Parade to recognize Connemara Stallions and Connemara Sporthorse Stallions to follow final Connemara class.

45. Dales Pony In Hand Open to Dales and Partbred Dales of all ages. Each pony will be presented individually to the judge and will be handled by the judge. The pony must stand still for this inspection and trained to lift a foot. The pony will be expected to walk away from the judge and then walk back, then trot away, a good long active trot, and back, this time carrying on past the judge before returning to the line. The judge is looking for straight powerful action and the pony should be trained to trot freely when asked. The handler should run at the pony's shoulder and in time with the pony's stride. Once all the ponies have been looked at, the judge may either ask for a final walk round before calling them back in for the final placing.
46. Dales Pony Ridden Traditional and Intermediate Open to both Traditional (W/T) and Intermediate/Open (W/T/C), exhibitor when performing "show." Traditional class judged on conformation, trot and walk and ponies should be well balanced, very free and active, really covering the ground. Ponies will work together in the arena at walk and trot at judge's command, then line up to be called forward by judge for conformation and individual show exhibit. Canter is not expected in the group show. A break from trot to canter will be penalised by the judge.

The individual show should include a figure of eight or rider's choice at trot (include canter Intermediate/Open), collected on the bends but really pushing into extension across the diagonals, hand gallop if Intermediate/Open, and finishing with an extended trot on the long side of the ring before a smooth transition back to walk. A rein back may sometimes be asked for, and the pony should step back for four paces without being hauled backwards, and move then forward to a square halt before returning to line. Prizes will be awarded to both Traditional and Intermediate/Open depending on entries.

ACPS Region I Perpetual Awards

The following championships require competitor reporting, so please try to keep track throughout the weekend and be ready to submit to the secretary as soon as possible following your last qualifying class. Some Awards combine results of classes from the Hartland Riding Club, CVDA, and ACPS Region I shows. Forms are available at the booth.

***RHF O'HARAZAN PERPETUAL TROPHY FOR GRAND CHAMPION PUREBRED
CONNEMARA***

Awarded to the Purebred Connemara accruing the most points across In Hand (mandatory), Jumpers (classes 22-26, with one extra point for class 24 and two extra points for 25 and 26), English WTC Pleasure (classes 6, 10) and Dressage (Training and above; two extra points will be given for First level and above, if score is 57% or higher).

ACPS REGION I JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP

Awarded to the junior riders (who have not turned 19 by 1/1/26) accruing the most and second most points in three ridden performance classes, and Novice or Junior Handler (mandatory). Sportsmanship points may be added to overall total by any judge or show staff. Each competitor must submit a completed Pony Quiz to the secretary's booth by NOON on Sunday. The Pony Quiz can be picked up at the secretary's booth when you check in. The Pony Quiz score counts toward the championship points.

SUE DEXTER MEMORIAL VERSATILITY AWARD

Awarded to the purebred or halfbred Connemara, or Connemara Sporthorse, accruing the most points in Mounted WTC Trail (mandatory-class 30 or 31), English WTC Pleasure (class 6, 10),

Jumpers (classes 22-26, with one extra point for class 24, and two extra points for classes 25 and 26), and Dressage (Training and above; two extra points will be given for First level and above, if score is 57% or higher.) The rider/pony combination must be the same for all classes.

HALFBRED/CONNEMARA SPORTHORSE AWARD

Awarded to the Halfbred Connemara or Connemara Sporthorse with the most points in any five ridden classes.

THE SCHOOL PONY SAINT New for 2026

The Schoolmaster Award: Presented to the purebred or halfbred Connemara, or Connemara Sporthorse, with the highest point total who is exhibited by two or more riders at the show. Top four placings in any ridden classes to count (including Costume Class, even if being led, if rider is mounted). The following additional points will be awarded to the overall total: two points for each rider under 12; two points for each rider over 70; one point for each rider aged 12-17; one point for each rider aged 60-70 (*honor system accepted for age of older adults*). "Rider Age Bonus Points" will be awarded even if these riders' individual results are not included in the top four placings.

HIGH POINT DRESSAGE SENIOR AND JUNIOR AWARDS

Presented to the purebred or halfbred Connemara, or Connemara Sporthorse, with the highest overall percentage score in a ridden dressage test at the CVDA Show, run concurrently with the ACPS Region I Show. Dressage scores will be weighted for the degree of difficulty as follows (minimum score of 57% required for bonus points):

Introductory 0 points added
Training 2 points added
First 4 points added
Second 6 points added
Third 8 points added
Fourth 10 points added
FEI 12 points added

TRAIL CHAMPION AWARD

The Beryl Eddy Memorial Trophy

Presented to the purebred or halfbred Connemara, or Connemara Sporthorse, with the highest overall score in a ridden WTC trail class at the Hartland Riding Club Show, run the day before the ACPS Region I Show. Classes 30 or 31 to count.

Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement

WARNING

Under Vermont Law, an equine activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities that are obvious and necessary, pursuant to 12 V.S.A. § 1039. (Added 1995, No. 136 (Adj. Sess.), § 2.)

GMHA Event/Activity: Hartland Riding Club Horse Show/ACPS Region I Connemara Breed Show _____ **Date(s):** July 17-19, 2026

For and in consideration of Green Mountain Horse Association ("GMHA") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a GMHA sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities ("GMHA Event(s)"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any GMHA Event involves risks and dangers including, with-out limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the control of the GMHA Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the GMHA Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any GMHA Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any GMHA Event.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any GMHA Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: the Green Mountain Horse Association, Inc. (dba "GMHA") or any of the Officers, Directors, Trustees, Employees and Volunteers. I further agree to hold the Green Mountain Horse Association, Inc., the Officers, Directors, Trustees, Employees, Volunteers and Landowners, the sanctioning/licensing organization (the "Released Parties of Event Organizers") free and harmless from any liability, claims, suits or damages of whatsoever kind or nature that may be occasioned by the horse(s) used by me or the negligence of the person(s) in charge of such horse(s) and I agree to indemnify and hold harmless this organization and individuals against all liability claims, suits, and expenses including attorney fees incurred arising out of any injury to any person or damage to any property caused by me, my horse(s) or attendants. I agree that if any harm occurs to me or my horse or to any equipment that I may use or intend to use, with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the GMHA Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties. I agree that as a condition of acceptance of entry, GMHA may use photographs, videos, and or other likenesses of the participant and horse taken while at GMHA for any reasonable purpose, including accident/incident/injury analysis, promotion, coverage, or the benefit of the event and/or of GMHA. I agree that if I am injured while participating in this event, the Woodstock Emergency Services personnel treating my injuries may provide a description of the accident, a description of the suspected injury, a description of the treatment administered and information about transport to a hospital to GMHA personnel for the purpose of completing the official GMHA Accident/Injury report.

This authorization will expire once the information is given to GMHA personnel or at the end of the event, whichever is later.

COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.
